Therefore we have the uninsured poor and needy who continue to depend on the Raphael Community Free Clinic and other Christian charities to keep them well and out of the emergency rooms.

Raphael Clinic needs your support more than ever before. Drug costs keep increasing as do medical supplies and testing. Historically the clinic's patients were given

x-rays and other radiology tests at no charge. Now the radiologists in Kerr county can no longer provide that service at no cost to the clinic or it's patients.

We understand that you also are facing increasing costs. However, we have patients who, without the clinic's services could go blind, loose a limb or even die. If you are unable to help us now, then consider leaving the clinic a large gift in your Last Will and Testament.

ANGELS ARE REAL THE RAPHAEL COMMUNITY FREE CLINIC By GREG FOREST



The name of archangel Raphael, in Standard Hebrew is described as serving the "God who heals", "God Heals", "God, and in Christian tradition performs all manners of healing. August 7, marked the founding of the Raphael Community Free Clinic whose mission is "to minister in a caring and Christian environment to the medically underserved of Kerrville and the surrounding area."

The clinic addresses the nonemergency medical needs of the uninsured. Residents of Bandera, Edward, Gillespie, Kendall, Kerr, Kimble, and Real Counties may qualify as patients. With the help of other local social and medical agencies such as Peterson Memorial Hospital, and community medical professionals, the clinic has worked with its partners to have the Clinic become a reality.

With Texas being a "low services" state, there is a large gap between those who have medical needs but have no insurance or are unable to qualify for any government assistance. Sometimes becoming ill inconveniently happens to those who don't qualify for government services such as Medicare or Medicaid. The onset of illness may not wait until a patient reaches the MediCare qualifying age of 65.

Sister Marge Novak, a Franciscan Sister and Family Nurse Practitioner, moved to Kerrville in 1995. Her vision of a medical mission for those who could not afford health insurance, espe-

cially the working poor, inspired a group of others to help bring the clinic about.

Raphael Community Free Clinic is a Funded Partner of Methodist Healthcare Ministries of South Texas. Raphael Clinic is supported by contributions from private foundations, individuals, churches and civic clubs. It neither requests nor accepts funds from city, state or Federal sources. So it is not only the staff and volunteers who have made this resource a reality but the entire Hill Country community as well.

Sister Marge Novak, with cofounder Sister Mary Ann Giardina have built a monument to giving and sacrifice to help those in the region who need it most. The clinic's staff and cadre of 70 volunteers provides a wide variety of medical and pharmacy services ranging from prenatal care, diabetes treatment and education to Hep C treatment and cardiovascular care.


Clinic Spotlight
